





Robin Dieter

Here is the result of a recent experiment in “edge-to-edge” quilting with my embroidery machine. A lot of my experiments are cat cuddle size. This has 6 hoopings done with a magnetic hoop. I have some new software that helps in setting everything up to be the right size to match up perfectly. Each hooping took only 2 minutes to stitch out, so it took less than half an hour to quilt this piece. And this was my first time attempting this, so I thought that was pretty good. I’ve included a photo of the back to show that if you want the quilting to blend in, that looks good too and the back looks just as nice as the front. I think this will be a good alternative for me to get away from stitch-in-the-ditch quilting. It really is as easy as they claim.


