Pinwheel Star



Finished size 12"

Fabrics: Two contrasting batiks (one light, one dark)

Cutting Instructions

Light background fabric:

Four 3 ½" squares (corner squares)

Two 4" squares (pinwheels)

One 7 1/4" square (flying geese)

Dark star fabric:

Two 4" squares (pinwheels)

Four 3 7/8" squares (flying geese)

The block is made up of 4 half-square triangles, 4 flying geese, and 4 corner squares.

Half-square triangles: Place one 4" light square on a 4" dark square, right sides together. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of drawn line. Cut along the line, forming two half-square triangles. Press seams to the dark fabric. Trim to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat with the other set of 4" squares.

Now, join them together to create the center pinwheel (refer to photo for placement).

Flying Geese: We used the Fast Flying Geese method, but feel free to use whatever method, you are comfortable with. You will be making four 3" x 6" finished geese.

Assembling the Block (refer to the photo for placement)

Top row: Corner square, flying geese, corner square. Press to the corner squares.

Middle row: Flying geese, pinwheel, flying geese. Press to the pinwheel.

Bottom row: Corner square, flying geese, corner square. Press to the corner squares.
