February 5, 2020**

President Alys Hay called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. A quorum was present. We welcomed several guests: Sue Deal and Metha Schuler of the Petaluma Quilt Guild, Patsy Ronat of the Guild of Quilters of Contra Costa County with their lovely Opportunity Quilt, and MQSC guild affiliate Shannon Marshall of Sonoma County Sewing Company.

We also welcomed two new members, Carol Kenyon and Christy Ridgeway.

Katina Repp and Frances Ramirez won the name tag drawings.

Sue Peretti-Keith moved that the January minutes be approved, and Cyndi Cunningham seconded her motion. The minutes were unanimously approved with no changes or corrections.

Vice-President's Report: Karen Derrick reported that she had four squares left of the chartreuse fabric required as part of the VP challenge, "When Life Throws You a Monkey Wrench." The rules for this challenge can be found on the MQSC website. Karen amplified the instructions, saying that there is more than one Monkey Wrench block, any one of them can be chosen for your challenge piece!

Website Update: The handouts used at the Round Robin held in January are now on the Basic Skills page of our website. These handouts included techniques for bindings and borders – a great resource!

Treasurer's Report: While Michelle Crosbie is out of town Alys reported that the Guild has reported January revenue from Opportunity Quilt tickets, meeting raffles, Quilt Show vendor payments and membership dues. The checking

account balance is approximately \$38,000, including deposits for the Quilt Retreat, which will be paid out in March.

Membership Report: Deana Abramowitz and Kathy Vedder reported that we have 13 new members for a total of 147 members this year. The new member tea is March 28 at Village Sewing Center. Everyone is welcome; there will be sharing and snacks! Please sign up with Membership if you wish to attend.

Patsy Ronat from Guild of Quilters of Contra Costa County promoted ticket sales for her Guild's Opportunity Quilt, Fiesta, a celebration of the many communities and diversity of Contra Costa County.

Affiliate Presentation: Shannon Marshall, owner of Sonoma County Sewing Company, offering classes for beginner sewing, long arm quilting, and training. Her shop, located next to Molsberry's at Larkfield Shopping Center, is also a maker space and offers rental time with her embroidery, overlock and quilting equipment.

Committee Reports:

Medallions: Round 3 was due at the February 5 business meeting; please connect with Dale Yamamura or Trina Jahnsen if you are experiencing a delay. There are still some slots available for future rounds of some medallions – the next round is to be completed in May.

Programs and Workshops: Cyndi Cunningham is available to take workshop signups for the Lisa Thorpe's Gelli Printing Class held at the Vets Memorial Building on February 19, as well as Mel Beach's Free Motion Quilting Workshop on March 21, held at Village Sewing Center.

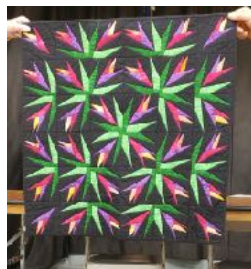

This class will be held on Saturday, **April 25th**, at Village Sewing Center. The class begins at 10:30 (Set-up at 10am) and ends at 3 pm.

Prerequisite - This is not a beginner class. You must have some experience with free motion quilting.

This includes knowing how to set up your machine for free motion quilting including:

1. How to drop your feed dogs...
2. Which is the appropriate foot your machine suggests for free motion quilting...
3. What the settings are on your machine for free motion quilting...

SUPPLY LIST

- A. Sewing machine set up for free motion quilting with a free motion foot
- B. Four quilt sandwiches approximately 26" x 18" (just muslin or scraps with batting between the fabrics)
- C. Contrasting thread to quilt your sandwiches

We will have the first sign-ups for this class on Wednesday, February 19th, and if room is available, on March 4th.

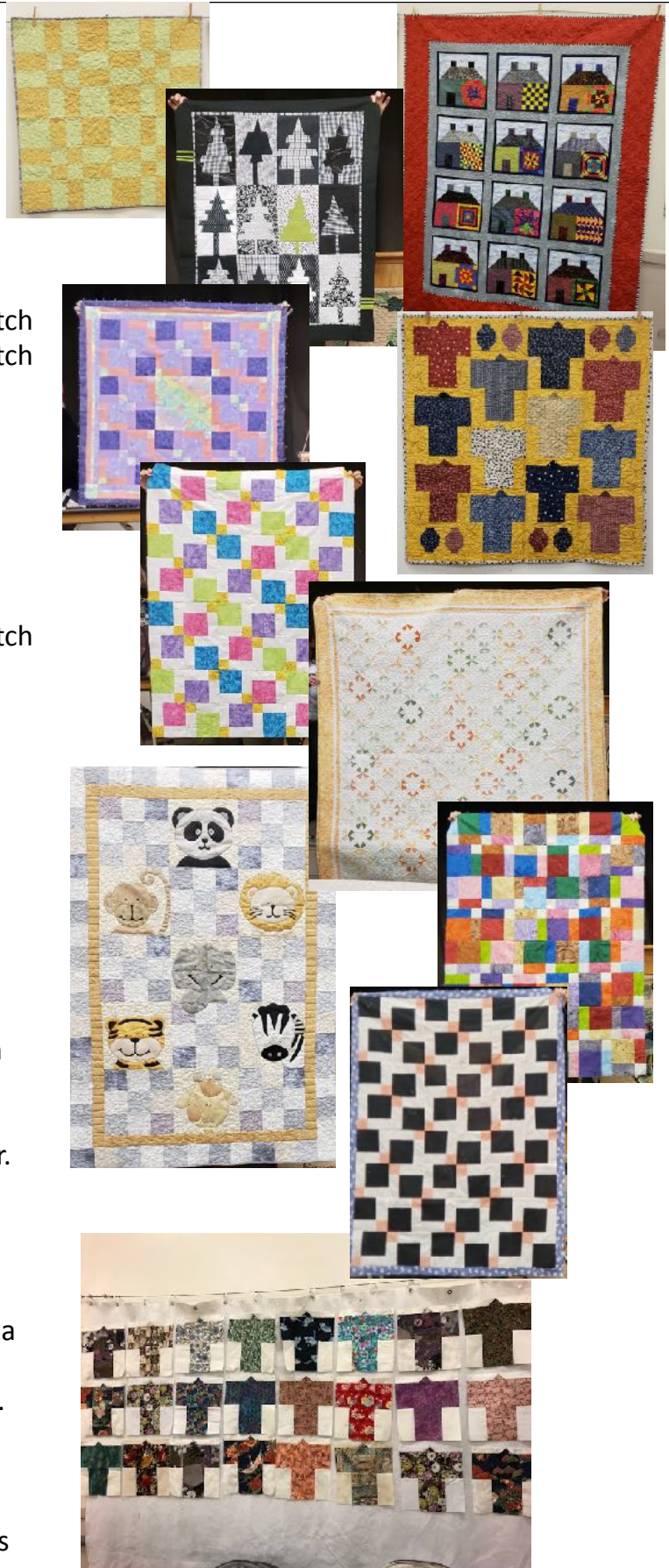

We are sure your quilting is almost finished and the binding is cut for this year's 2020 Quilt Show. While you're stitching the binding, think about an exciting quilt book to read to design and create your next year's quilt show-stopper.

There are so many designs for Mother's Day and Independence Day quilts, Halloween and Thanksgiving quilts. We have books for traditional, contemporary and modern quilts. There are books about photo realistic, abstract and thread-painted quilts. We have books of American, Asian, European and Australians quilts. We even have books about quilters, real and fantasy.

But if you still can't find the perfect quilt book you're looking for, on April 15th at the Spring Fabric Sale, we will bring out more boxes of gently used books, donated by previous quilters and saved in our storage unit. There are nearly a dozen boxes of books, too many for our Library Cabinet to hold. There are duplicates, out of print and even antique quilt books.

These books are being sold "By the Pound," not by hardback or paperback, the rarity, thickness or by the number of pages. We don't have a list of these books.
