**Moonlight Quilters of Sonoma County
Board Meeting Minutes
January 6, 2020**

President Alys Hay called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m., upon confirming a quorum. Marilyn Lira moved for approval of the November 2019 board minutes; Karen Derrick seconded her motion and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: In Michelle Crosbie's absence, she has sent a report and financial statements as of December 31, 2019. In summary, all federal and state returns have been filed and accepted, with the exception of the raffle permit, which was submitted late. This includes non-profit statements. No more are due until 1/15/2021. The next raffle permit will be due July 1, 2020. Michelle is still researching director and officer insurance.

Vice-President's Report: Karen Derrick reported that the Vets' Building contract has been approved, with a savings of almost \$900 over last year's agreement. Part of this savings is due to a reduction of meeting hours scheduled; the balance is savings from purchasing our own microphone, to be stored with the library cart. Vice-President's Challenge – as approved at the November board meeting, the VP Challenge is on! A ten-inch square of chartreuse Kona can be purchased for \$1 from Karen, required to be included in the block. Full rules are posted on the MQSC website.

Quilt Show: Monthly committee meetings will start January 16. Vendor contracts have already started coming in.

Community Relations: We received a request for holiday gift bags via our Facebook page. Marilyn Lira and Alys were able to pull holiday themed fabrics from their personal stashes and make the bags in time for the Cotati Police Department's Cocoa and

Cookies with a Cop party for kids in need. Now that we know about this program, Alys will follow up with contacts in order to plan for next year's gift bag production without the rush. Many thanks to Marilyn and Alys for their fast, generous response on MQSC's behalf!

A thank you quilt has been completed for gifting to Joanne Garrett, daughter of a woman who passed away. Ms. Garrett donated a lot of her mother's fabric to MQSC last year. Marilyn showed off the completed blue and yellow quilt, a collaboration of many MQSC members, assembled by Marilyn and quilted by Saraj Cory.

E-mail Blast Guidelines needed – Originally, blasts were expected to be for time-sensitive announcements from members between newsletters, with the intent of minimizing the amount of email generated to membership. In practice, we are getting requests from outside organizations, businesses and random members of the community requesting that we publicize sales, other organizations' events or asking for help with a quilt-related project. We need clearer guidelines.

After much discussion, the board agreed that the e-mail blast button on the MQSC website should be moved to the members-only page. In general, the board agreed that the blasts are to be used for reminders (e.g., time to pay dues, remember to buy raffle tickets for the opportunity quilt). Representatives of other organizations are welcome to make presentations at our meetings, but they should not use e-blasts.

Facebook page and group: Michelle Crosbie has offered to serve as interim manager of our social media. Margie Gross, a former MQSC member, has been administrator for an MQSC Facebook group using our name and logo. The group does not require MQSC membership. Margie prefers to keep the group open to all quilters (whether or not

a guild member), so she changed its name to "Sonoma County Quilters." It was moved and seconded and the board voted to thank Margie for changing the group name to Sonoma County Quilters, and to ask her to remove any and all references to Moonlight Quilters of Sonoma County and the use of our logo. Michelle will relay this decision to Margie. Michelle will take over administration of the MQSC group page which will be exclusive to MQSC members.

2020-21 Opportunity Quilt – Nancy Samples is coordinating the next quilt, The design plan was approved by acclamation.

Board meeting schedule – Alys requested that we revert to quarterly board meetings, with the expectation that we can cover all business with fewer meetings. The next meeting will be on March 2 or March 9 – please email Alys with your availability!

Storage Units – Now that we have a clear idea of costs for storage unit rental, and demand for storage has settled down after the fires, we will research pricing of similar spaces to ensure that we are getting the best possible rate.

Generic email addresses – the board agreed that generic emails for board positions will simplify communication with members as well as the public, while retaining privacy for recipients and ensuring communications even as specific position holders change over the years. Alys, Trina and Karen Derrick will facilitate email address set up for all positions. They will have the format of MQSCpositionname@gmail.com. Board members must get these set up by Alys, Trina or Karen as administrators. Information on how

to utilize these email addresses should be added to position-holder binders.

Quilt Show Featured Artist compensation – topic for further discussion: offering an honorarium or stipend for well-known quilt artists as inducement to be the featured artist, perhaps on an every-other-year basis. The ability to pay a stipend would allow us to reimburse the artist for a share in the expense of bringing such an artist to the northern California area.

Update your binder! Binder holders, please review the contents of your binder and use the check list provided by Norma Jean to ensure that it is complete and up-to-date (deadlines for relevant actions, contact information, etc.) for passing on to the next person!

Business Meeting Minutes
January 8, 2020**

President Alys Hay called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., after determining that there was a quorum, as required.

She welcomed John Furtado from Village Sewing Center and Jennie Alexich from East Bay Heritage Quilters.

Jennie of East Bay Heritage Quilters introduced two beautiful opportunity quilts and spoke about their quilt show, Voices in Cloth, being held March 20-21. Meeting attendees had the opportunity to buy raffle tickets for the opportunity quilts and discounted tickets for their quilt show.

Upon a motion from Cyndi Cunningham, seconded by Geri Cross, the November business meeting minutes were approved unanimously.

With an eye toward minimizing our operating expenses, the board approved the purchase of a microphone compatible with the Vets Memorial Building sound system. We had been paying \$20 per meeting to rent the Vets' microphone. A microphone cost approximately \$100. The microphone will be kept with the library cart.

The annual rental contract with the Veterans Memorial Building has been signed. We have reduced the use of our meeting room by thirty minutes for most of our meetings. Between the savings created by the half-hour meeting space rental reduction and the use of our own microphone, we will see savings of \$900 this year.

Treasurer's Report: While Michelle is away on "vacation" she has provided the following information: As of 12/31/19, the Vets Hall contract has been signed and 2020 rent paid. Due to a change in our post office box

address, we received a property tax bill late. The bill has been paid, along with the late fee. All other bills have been paid and non-profit returns filed. The cash flow for the year to date is positive with \$5,148.91 more in funds received than has been paid out.

Programs & Workshops The January Basic Skills workshop will be focused on making the disappearing nine-patch block, and will be held at Village Sewing Center on January 18. Mel Beach will be the teacher for the March workshop on machine quilting.

Round Robin-Coordinator Kay Hawkins has rounded up a fun group of short tutorials for this camping-themed evening. Please print the handouts for each station from the MQSC website and bring to the meeting on Jan 15.

Quilt Show-Coordinators We will begin accepting quilt entries February 1. Entries can only be submitted online; if you need help, contact Trina – her committee will be available at meetings to photograph quilts and help those without computers submit their entries.

He referred all of us to youtube videos that VSC has produced – you can search under VSC on the youtube site.

After the regularly scheduled drawings for raffle baskets, block of the month, and presentations for friendship blocks, the meeting was adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
